Includes plans and projects (over \$50k) that maintain, improve, or add to City infrastructure



Includes discrete projects (ex: N. McDowell Blvd. Complete Streets) and ongoing programs (ex: Safe Streets Quick Builds); programs tend to be made up of several similar projects throughout the City



Submitted to City Council for consideration each May



Adopted budget applies to upcoming fiscal year (July 1 – June 30) only, but Capital Improvement Plan covers five-year period



5-Year Capital Improvement Plan subject to change each year as projects are identified and reprioritized



Current All Ages & Abilities (AAA) Bike Network



AAA Bike Network: End of 2025



AAA Bike Network: End of 2026


67 miles / 59% of Draft AT Plan Network
