 - Peggy the maps and the audits will take the majority of the time and engagement from the specific schools
- ii. City Update on Plans and Projects:
 - Active Transportation Plan & Upcoming Street Projects
 - Public Works Updates
 - ATP—Open House at Community Center in late October; offer to bring the maps to local schools and focus on those areas; comments by sunday, 11/19, can be incorporated in next revision (Mady asked for a Study session at next Board mtg); doing engagements in chunks, making revisions and refine as it goes along; BPAC meets monthly as a checkpoint to share progress; to share with school families, Jpegs are best to share on Parent Square; b/w now and March, can take feedback from the school communities
 - Safe Streets Nomination Program Update
 - 200 requests; averaging 10 a day; requests are very detailed; score all the projects, then can implement a handful of projects to make improvements
 - Slow the Fast Down Petaluma—take the pledge on the webpage (speeding is #1 cause of collisions in Petaluma)
 - Follow up from McDowell Elem—school zone signage is in and two speed feedback signs are coming; Walk Audit scheduled; Bus drivers asked to slow to 15mph on McGregor Ave.
 - Transit
 - o Transit to host "Stuff the Bus" toy and food drive Dec 2, details TBD
 - Fare-free weekends from 1/25-12/31 to promote carfree visitation to downtown for holiday shopping and dining
 - Transit has been hosting Kinder field trips on the buses
 - SCBC is in the process of establishing a training for drivers on bike and pedestrian/share the road awareness
 - Police
 - Traffic actively working works M-S (street enforcement), 4 motors max on Wed/Thu, then spread out through the week
 - just launched Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) grant of \$425,000. 3/4 going to DUI enforcement, rest is equipment and extra traffic enforcement. focus on primary collision factors (PCF) speeding, unsafe turning and DUI, in that order focusing on high incident areas
 - I Street gets a lot of attention has had 10 collisions, 0 injury collisions. North McDowell has had 168 collisions, 6 severe injury, 4 fatal: give efforts where it saves lives

- Holiday and special events coming up
- Lights Out program instead of giving a ticket for broken headlight, give a voucher
- Need to replenish bike helmet stock; cannot use OTS grant to purchase
- Lots going and with federal dollars to support.
